# 2022 Q2 BPL Quarterly Performance

## IN PERSON VISITS & NEW PATRONS


Despite ongoing pandemic impacts, the first 6 months of 2022 saw upward trends in many of our performance indicators. While we had about 50% fewer visits and PC sessions from 2019 levels, we gained 85% increase in visitors and 31% increase in PC usage over YTD last year.

New patron accounts also increased 36% from 2021 and has a gap of only 9% below 2019 levels—a good indicator that the community's desire for library services is still strong, despite not returning to 2019 levels.

#### Figure 3, 4, & 5 YTD Circulation

Physical circulation is growing with a 31% gain over YTD 2021 and achieving 67% of 2019 levels (down only 33% from 2019). Recall Meadows was closed until mid-February in 2022. Holds filled and borrowed is down both from 2019 levels as well as from 2021; fully re-opened collections in 2022 may account for the dip in holds requested from 2021 (when large parts of the collections were still closed in early 2021, placing holds was the only option).






Circulation (Collections) is the circulation of all BPL materials no matter where they circulated. Circulation (Patron Activity) is the circulation of all materials (incl. FLC and PROSP) by only BPL patrons. Total holds filled is any incoming Prospector/FLC materials plus all BPL materials that resulted in a filled hold for any library patron (includes outgoing Prospector/FLC materials).

Database use saw an increase over 2021 but a decrease from 2019 levels, while eCollections gained 61% increase over 2019, but a slight dip from 2021 (again, likely due to closed stacks being reopened and options for physical books returning in 2022.)







### **PROGRAMS**

All locations hosted programs and events in Q2 specially devoted to Summer of Discovery. Youth Services staff conducted numerous outreach events at community schools and locales to generate excitement for SoD in May and June.

Some services and programming are still offered virtually or as remote activity, and likely to continue as successful hybrid models of programming.

## SELECTED HIGHLIGHTS OF Q2

- April brought us the annual Family Play Festival, bringing songs and stories into all library locations.
- Seed to Table workshops included Gardening with Native Plants, Start your Spring Garden, Seedling
  Swap. The ever-busy BeeChicas held Start Seeds for Pollinator, Native Plants for Pollinators, and Meet
  the Bees events.
- June is Pride month, and the library held community celebrations with Pride Ponies with Out Boulder
   County, Pride Nail Painting, and an outreach event at the Boulder Pride Festival
- The **Summer of Discovery Outreach** visits to community schools in May and June reached over 2800 students with 20 visits!
- Summer of Discovery kicked off with a bang in June and now winds down into its last week: Over **4,200** registrants read over **1.5** million minutes. Go Readers! Special highlights for SoD in June were *Meet and Bleat with Goats*, *Bicycle Rodeo at Meadows*, and visit from author extraordinaire *Brian Pinkney*.
- Teen programs held many events with **Book Queeries**, **Anime Club**, **Tabletop Games**, and **Boulder High School art exhibit**.
- Branches continue to provide well attended storytimes for all ages, and unique programs for adults, such as *Explorations in Ceramics* (Reynolds), *Container Gardening* (Meadows).
- Building 61 brought some unique programs to their regular line up of technology classes, which included bilingual programming for Wooden Mexican Tree of Life.
